Correspondence and papers, 1619-1897, n.d., of the families of Ramsay and Dundas of Ochtertyre in Kincardine-of-Menteith, Perthshire, principally of the latter family. The papers were formerly on deposit in the Scottish Record Office as the Dundas of Ochtertyre Muniments (GD35), but some items held in the SRO were sold separately and are not included in the collection purchased by the Library: former SRO numbers are noted in square brackets in the entries below for the convenience of readers who have used the collection previously, but are there for information only and should not be used for reference purposes. For the Ochtertyre Manuscripts, the reminiscences, biographical essays etc, of John Ramsay of Ochtertyre deposited in the Library in 1936 and purchased, with the papers described below, in 1993, see MSS.1635-44 (*Catalogue of MSS*, vol.1).
